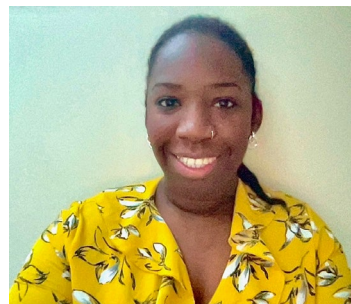


Dr Lorraine Haye
